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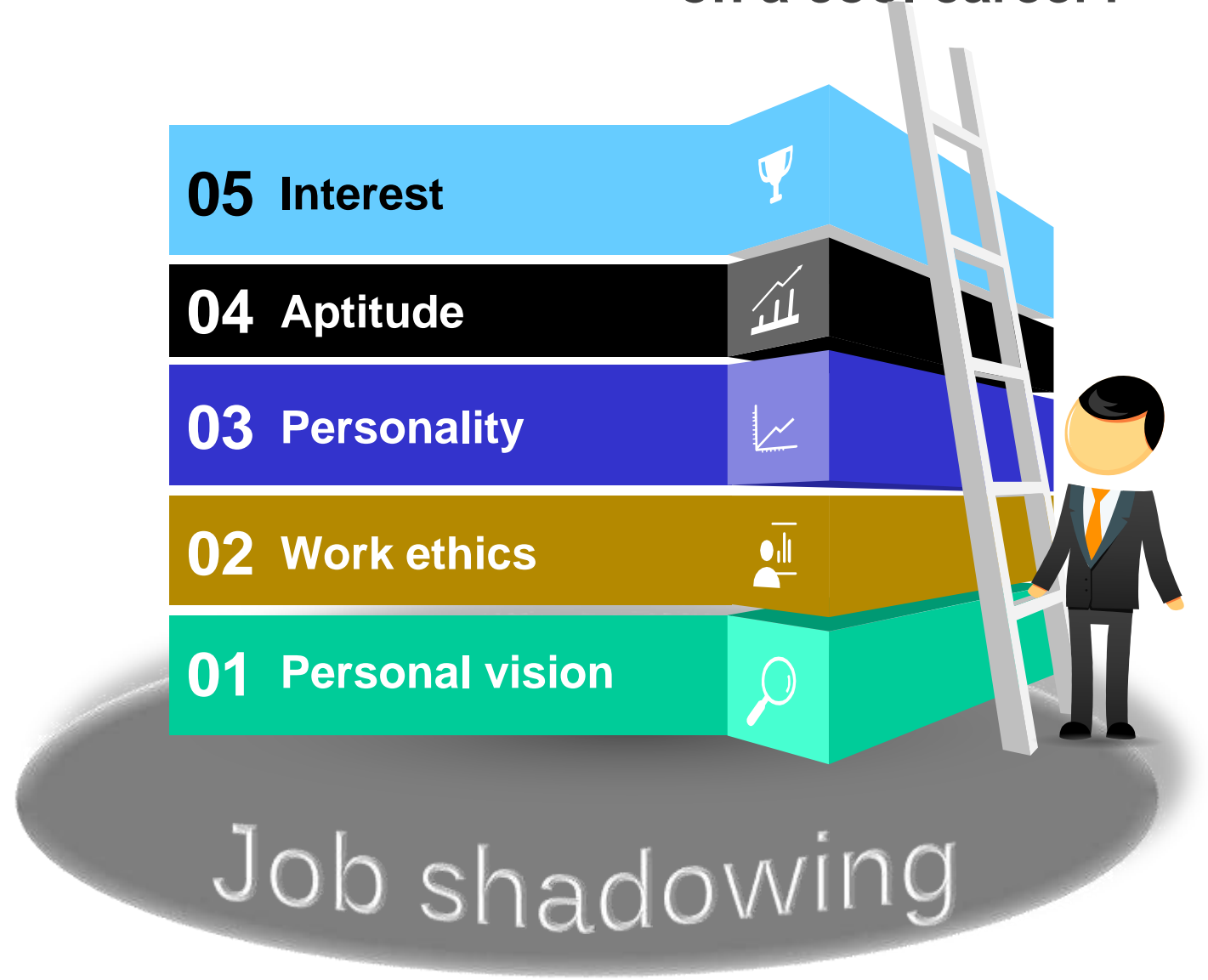
Why should you excel academically?

- Admission to programmes is dependent on academic achievement.
- Grade 11 and 12 marks determine your admission to programmes.
 - Grade 11 marks when you apply in Grade 12
 - Grade 12 marks when you apply during a gap year
- Achieve according to your potential.
- Tuks receives more than 43 000 applications annually for first-year studies and can only accommodate 10 500 first-year students.

NSC/IEB requirement



- The NSC/IEB is a 130-credit certificate rated at level 4 by the National Qualification Framework (NQF).

6 x 20-credit subjects	120 credits
1 x 10-credit subject (Life Orientation)	<u>10 credits</u>
Total	<u>130 credits</u>

- To obtain entrance to an institution of higher education, Universities South Africa (previously known as HESA) requires an NSC where the learner offers at least seven subjects:
 - Four compulsory subjects:
Home Language, First Additional Language, Mathematics OR Mathematical Literacy, Life Orientation
 - Three choice subjects from the designated subject list (20-credit subjects)

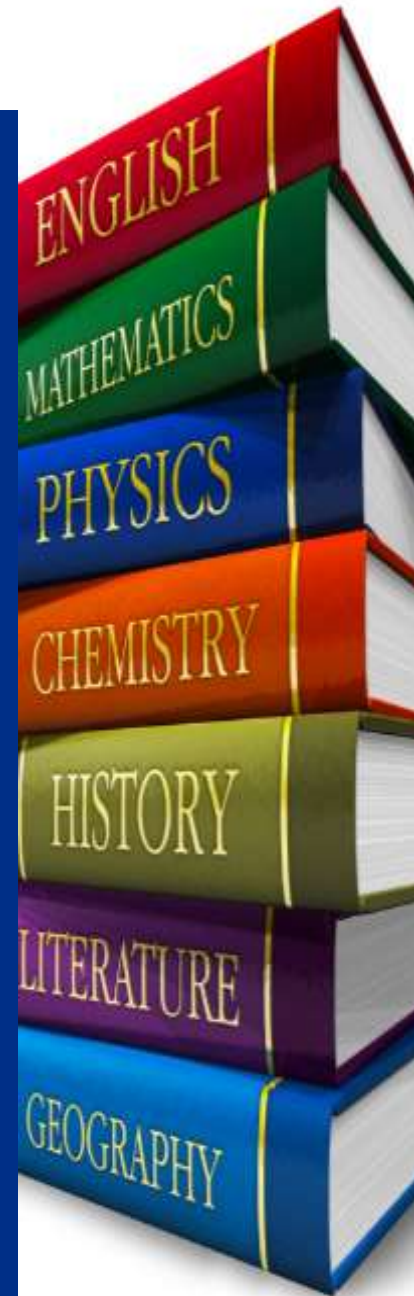
NSC/IEB requirement: University access

- To obtain university entrance for degree purposes UNIVERSITIES SOUTH AFRICA (previously known as HESA) requires a NSC with an achievement rating of at least 4 (50-59%) in four recognised NSC 20-credit subjects from the designated list.

Please take note that Life Orientation is the only 10-credit subject.



University/faculty-specific requirements

Calculation of the Admission Point Score (APS)

- The calculation of an Admission Point Score (APS) is based on a candidate's achievement level in six recognised 20-credit subjects **(including subjects from the non-designated subject list, eg CAT, Tourism, Hospitality Studies and Civil, Electrical & Mechanical Technology, etc).**
- Take note that Life Orientation is excluded when the APS is calculated because it is a 10-credit subject.
- The calculation of the APS is done on a 7-point rating scale:

Achievement	Achievement level	Marks
7	Outstanding achievement	80-100%
6	Meritorious achievement	70-79%
5	Substantial achievement	60-69%
4	Adequate achievement	50-59%
3	Moderate achievement	40-49%
2	Elementary achievement	30-39%
1	Not achieved	0-29%

Minimum admission requirements

- Meet ALL admission requirements to be admitted to a programme
 - Subject requirements
 - Admission Point Score (APS) requirement

the Faculties of Education, Humanities, Theology, Law and the School of Information Technology.

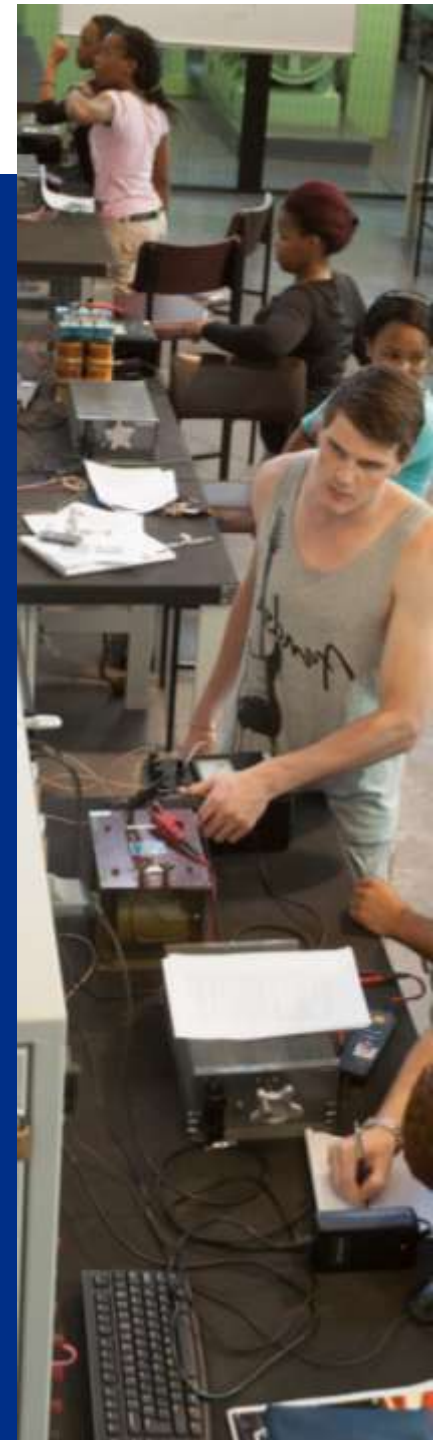
What are the differences between selection and open programmes?

Selection programmes

- Early closing dates: **31 May** and/or **30 June**
- Academic selection based on school results
- Additional selection criteria, eg NBT, Value-added Questionnaire, portfolio's, etc
- Selection process and provisional admission only **after closing date**

Open programmes

- Later closing dates
- Academic selection based on school results
- Selection process and provisional admission start **on receipt of application**



What is an extended programme?

These are programmes that you can apply for if you do not meet all the minimum admission requirements for a specific programme.

Offered in the following faculties:

- Engineering, Built Environment and Information Technology
ENGAGE programme
- Natural and Agricultural Sciences
BSc – Extended Programme for the Biological and Agricultural Sciences
BSc – Extended Programme for the Physical Sciences
BSc – Extended Programme for the Mathematical Sciences
- Economic and Management Sciences
BCom – Extended Programme
- Veterinary Science
BSc – Extended Programme for the Biological and Agricultural Sciences

 - Proof of payment of the R300 application fee

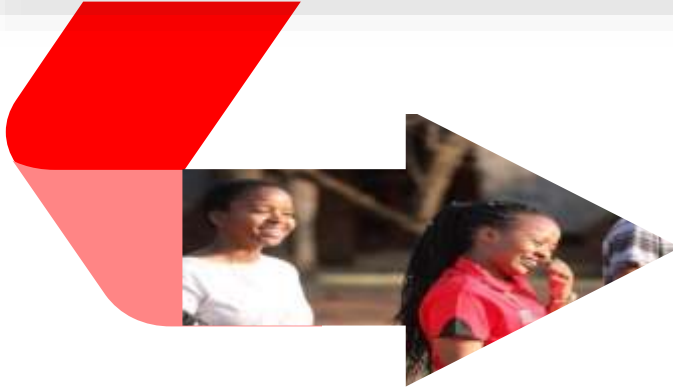
